The plan will be voted on by the coalition voting members via a roll call vote at the July 16th ISAP meeting. The final plan will then be submitted to Mid-South by the July 24th due date.

## Drug Free Communities Grant Site Visit

On June 4, Lavencia Sugars, Drug Free Communities Grant Project Coordinator from SAMHSA in Washington, D.C. visited Ingham County to learn more about our coalition initiatives to reduce substance abuse. She visited Cristo Rey Community Center, which is the fiduciary for the grant. While visiting, Ms. Sugars heard from many county stakeholders around the work we do here in Ingham County. Eric Trojanowicz from the Ingham County Sheriff's Office spoke about law enforcement compliance checks. Mike Botke explained the Lansing Teen Court early intervention peer jury program. ISAP's work with the Domino Strategy with the Lansing Lugnuts was featured in the FACE national newsletter earlier this spring. The Domino Strategy for responsible alcohol use is a comprehensive program, yet easy to use. It includes a variety of media explaining the 0-1-2 low-risk consumption

guidelines, the definition of a standard drink, details on who should not drink alcohol and circumstances where people should not drink, the caloric content of alcoholic beverages and the "domino effect" of outcomes that can occur from drinking too much.
